### PRIDE OF PLACE

We are continuing to carry out a program of planting and litter control. Last year we installed a bench overlooking the old kiln.

We secured funding for a row of large Horse Chesnuts on the North of the village and will landscape the area to create a new public space for villagers

We continue to participate in the anti litter league. Last year alone we filled 2 1/2 skips.

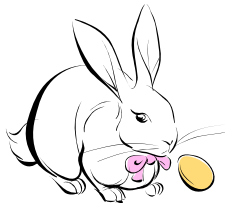

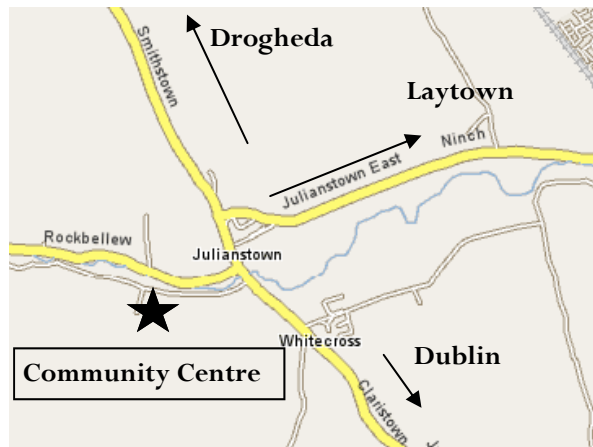
